Classification descriptions are intended to present a descriptive list of the range of duties performed by employees in this class and are not intended to reflect all duties performed within the job.

GENERAL FUNCTION

This is skilled work in the operation of maintenance equipment for the Pierce County Parks and Recreation Services Department. An employee in this classification is responsible for driving various vehicles and operating construction equipment such as dump truck, loader, backhoes, tractors, mowers, or related maintenance equipment. Work involves driving a wide variety of vehicles and operating various pieces of equipment, towing equipment to various park locations or hauling grass, sand, rocks, brush, and other debris. Employees may be assigned to perform duties in other Park Maintenance Technician assignments. Work is performed with considerable independence with limited supervision and is reviewed by the Parks Maintenance Supervisor.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

- Drives dump truck to various park locations, hauls sand, gravel, rocks, dirt, brush, and other debris.
- Pick up, hauls, and delivers equipment such as mowers, backhoe, loader, tractor, spraying equipment or other related piece of equipment.
- Operates various pieces of construction equipment at various park locations.
- Performs preventative maintenance on related equipment such as grease fittings, check oil and fluid levels, and performs other related maintenance assignments.
- Orders supplies and materials, picks up and delivers materials from various vendors.
- May assist other park staff.

OTHER JOB FUNCTIONS

- May be assigned to perform other Park Maintenance Technician assignments.
- May be assigned to use and operate mowers, sprayers, and other hand/power tools.
- May lead other staff.
- Performs other job functions as assigned.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES

- Knowledge of the use and safe operation of a wide variety of construction equipment such as dump truck, backhoe, loader, tractor, sprayer, aerator, and other maintenance equipment.
- Knowledge of safe work practices and hazardous conditions affiliated with the use and operation of heavy duty equipment.
- Ability to drive and operate a variety of construction equipment.
- Ability to order, pick up, and deliver supplies and materials.
- Ability to provide direction, assistance, and training to other maintenance staff on the use and operation of various pieces of equipment and machinery.
- Ability to perform related preventative maintenance assignments on related hand/power tools,

equipment, or other related maintenance tasks.

- Ability to perform Park Maintenance Technician 1 assignments.
- Ability to assist other park staff.
- Ability to physically perform the essential job functions.
- Ability to meet the travel requirements of the position.

RECRUITING REQUIREMENTS

Two or more years of commercial truck driving, equipment operation, or related construction work. Additional related education or training may substitute for up to one year of experience for the recruiting requirements. Possession of, or the ability to obtain, a valid Washington State Driver's license. Possession of, or the ability to obtain, a valid Washington State Commercial Driver's license (CDL Class A Certification) is required. Possession of, or the ability to obtain, a valid Washington State Public Pesticide License may be required. Satisfactory physical condition may be required as indicated by a County approved physical examination. Must be willing to work any shift assigned or at any location as needed. Employees may be required to provide their own tools.
