Random Check of Ballots

Per RCW 29A.60.170(4) a random audit of batches is required. On August 7, 2018 the political party observer coordinators requested the required audit of ballots be conducted for the 29th Legislative District Representative, Position No. 1. Our system uses five digital scanners and one central count server. A random batch from each scanner was drawn, hand tallied, and compared to the machine report. All results of the hand tally for the chosen race matched the machine report.
